#### **ALEXANDER BLACK HOUSE**

Many exciting developments are taking place in Blacksburg just now – new technology businesses are coming to Main Street; Tech's new Performing Arts Center is under construction, and the Alexander Black House is on its way to becoming a museum and cultural center in the heart of town. The one-of-a-kind Victorian manse embodies not just our heritage, but our future . . . It will have a catering kitchen, meeting rooms and events space for the entire community to enjoy. One day soon, the house will serve again as the town's "living room" – much as it did during Alexander Black's own lifetime.

We are looking for people who can host small gatherings of neighbors and friends in their homes. Our purpose is to share exhibits and other materials describing progress to date in bringing the Black House back to life. If you are willing to provide refreshments at a time and day of your choosing, our community organizers will provide a speaker and multimedia educational materials. A 15 to 20 minute program has been prepared that will describe the Black House

restoration initiative and also solicit support for the effort. It promises to be a fun way to spread the good news about the Black House – and a productive way to gather with people you enjoy.
