SWEETHEART CHOCOLATE LOLLIPOPS

What You Need

1 pkg. (4 oz.) BAKER'S Unsweetened Chocolate

3/4 cup butter

2 cups sugar

3 eggs

1 tsp. vanilla

2 cups flour

1 pkg. (4 oz.) BAKER'S White Chocolate

Assorted Valentine sprinkles

Make It

HEAT oven to 350°F.

MICROWAVE unsweetened chocolate and butter in large microwaveable bowl on HIGH 2 minutes or until butter is melted. Stir until chocolate is completely melted and mixture is well blended. Add sugar; mix well. Blend in eggs and vanilla. Add flour; mix well. Refrigerate 1 hour or until dough is stiff.

SHAPE dough into 30 (2-inch) balls; insert lollipop stick into each ball. Place, 2 inches apart, on baking sheets sprayed with cooking spray.

BAKE 8 min. or just until firm. (Do not over bake.) Let stand on baking sheets 1 min.; transfer to wire racks. Cool completely.

MELT white chocolate; drizzle over lollipops. Decorate with sprinkles. Let stand until chocolate is firm.
